Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.**

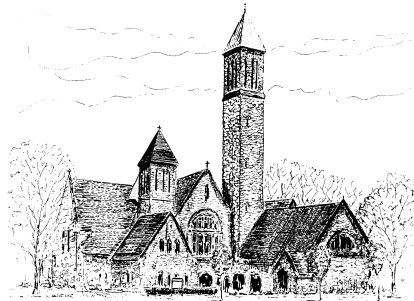

### ♦CALL TO WORSHIP (*responsive*)

Blow the trumpet in Zion! Sound the alarm on the holy mountain!

**The Lord our God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger,  
and abounding in steadfast love.**

### ♦PRAYER OF THE DAY (*responsive*)

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** Let us pray:

God of our salvation, we long to be reconciled to you. Help us to clear away and obstacle that prevents us from accepting the grace of Christ. No matter what we face in the this life, increase in us knowledge and patience, kindness and holiness of spirit, genuine love and truthful speech, so that, by the power of God at work in us, we may live even as we are dying and rejoice even in our sorrows. Though it may seem that we have nothing, if we are reconciled to you, we possess everything, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

### ♦LITANY OF PENITENCE (*responsive*)

Let us pray.

**Holy and merciful God, we confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.**

We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

**Have mercy on us, O God.**

We have not listened to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit. **Have mercy on us, O God.**

We confess to you, O God, all our past unfaithfulness: The pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives, **we confess to you, O God.**

Our self-indulgent appetites and ways and our exploitation of other people, **we confess to you, O God.**

Our anger at our own frustration and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves, **we confess to you, O God.**

Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work, **we confess to you, O God.**

Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the faith that is in us, **we confess to you, O God.**

Accept our repentance, O God, for the wrongs we have done. For our neglect of human need and suffering and our indifference to injustice and cruelty, **accept our repentance, O God.**

For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, **accept our repentance, O God.**

For our waste and pollution of your creation and our lack of concern for those who come after us, **accept our repentance, O God.**

Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.

**Favorably hear us, O God, for your mercy is great. Amen.**
