AN EPISTLE FROM PHIL TO ALL THE SAINTS AT FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF BUFFALO

Writing this before Christmas and knowing that most of you will see it after Christmas makes me wonder how to begin this letter harder to you. Should I include a Merry Christmas wish to my Happy New Year greeting? I think I will. So: “Merry Christmas and Happy New Year” to all the family and friends of First Presbyterian Church of Buffalo, NY.”

2012 is the bicentennial year of our congregation. Two hundred years ago a gaggle of faithful men and women came together to found a church on February 2, 1812. It is great to celebrate the faithfulness of a congregation that has performed significant ministry in such diverse areas as worship and preaching, Christian education, pastoral care, evangelism, social outreach with people from all over the world, and local ministry with people in need. Think of all the lives you and your forebears have touched. Imagine the faces that have smiled when the owner of the face remembered First Presbyterian Church fondly for friendship shared, and faith embodied.

As we celebrate our 200th anniversary we again face the kind of uncertain future that the founders of this congregation faced in their lives. Of course, the circumstances are different in almost every way. But one thing remains the same. We live, as they did, in uncertain times. We face issues that trouble and threaten us. It is a spirit that sent a young couple far from home by decree of a foreign power that made them go long distances for a head count, something that their religion expressly forbade as ungodly but something they were forced to do anyway. It is a spirit that brought shepherds and wise men to a dirty stable to find God's son. It is a spirit that, in good times and bad, always opens us in faith to see that in all times and in all places Emmanuel, God with us, is true.

So during this year we will work and pray together. We will be called upon to make hard choices, find new people with whom we will minister and new ways of sharing God's love. May we all enter this New Year with renewed faith, hope and love as we celebrate the joy of Jesus Christ our Lord.

CMO committee is asking for those interested in helping to plan a trip to come to a meeting on Sunday, January 8th in the CE Wing after church.

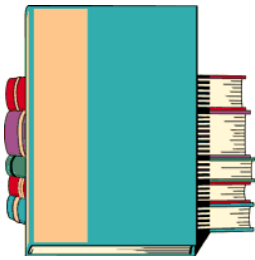

Remember the 4 R's: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair

As we enter 2012 many of us will take time to reflect on the past twelve months. This could be the year that you and your family resolve to make a real impact on the world. Some will consider resolutions to make changes for the better in the upcoming year.

This month I am writing about a few simple changes that can be made that will help the environment and in most instances will save you money. I hope that you will make a conscious effort to Go Green. Many of you have told me that you already do this. For most of us it is just making small, gradual changes in our lifestyle.

Recycling our old newspapers, bottles, even clothing is helping our planet to survive. Cutting back on fuel consumption, both at home and in the car is a benefit. Turn out the lights and lower your thermostat when you leave the house. Become conscious of ways to conserve energy, power and water.

When you leave home create your own personal "Going Green" kit. Some small items that can add up to a big impact include are:

- ☑ Taking reusable cloth totes to the market and your own reusable, stainless steel coffee thermos/ cup to favorite coffee shops to avoid using non-biodegradable foam cups. Better yet brew the coffee before you leave home and you will save money.
- ☑ There are plenty of ways to employ reusable items at the office. Opt for glasses, china cups, metal utensils, mechanical pencils, and refillable pens. To cut down on the main source of trash you're likely to produce during the day, save money, and improve your health all at once, bring your lunch rather than buying. At the very least, bring a set of your own silverware and a bottle of your favorite condiment to the office so you can skip the plastic utensils and the little packets of salt, pepper, ketchup and soy sauce.
- ☑ Use less paper by using both sides of the paper and don't forget to "Print Preview" before printing so you can avoid printing unnecessary stuff. Get off mailing lists by contacting catalog companies or anyplace for that matter. It really works
- ☑ Keep warm: It's one of the oldest, simplest, most effective technologies for staying cozy while saving heating fuel—layer up with extra sweaters and long underwear, and turn down the thermostat.
- ☑ It's a new year make a clean sweep – clear out closets and drawers, discarding worthless possessions that haven't been used recently. Donate unwanted items. Most closets, drawers, and cabinets are full of clothing, shoes, accessories, kitchen utensils, toys, and games that we do not need. It is amazing how much we can accumulate, thinking that we will find a use for that gadget or article of clothing that has been gathering dust for several years. The Salvation Army, Goodwill Industries or the St. Vincent de Paul Society will find a grateful recipient of your cast-offs and you will have a more streamlined place to live.
- ☑ Here is one suggestion that I just read about - Use revolving doors instead of swinging doors— it saves on heating and air conditioning expenses. Who knew? The next time I enter City Hall I will know which door to use.

One person CAN make a difference— start with simple green footsteps today then take these steps in the next week, next month and during the year ahead, living green.
